At Masévon Group B.V., we recognize our responsibility to protect human rights and the natural environment by sourcing minerals ethically and transparently. Our approach aligns with the EU Conflict Minerals Regulation (EU) 2017/821, which sets supply chain due diligence requirements for minerals originating from conflict-affected and high-risk areas.

Currently, Conflict Minerals include tin, tantalum, tungsten, and gold (3TG). In addition, Extended Minerals include cobalt, mica, copper, natural graphite, lithium, and nickel.

Our products may contain materials that include some of these minerals. We work closely with our supply chain partners to ensure responsible sourcing and transparency regarding the materials used. To support this, we aim to provide completed CMRT and EMRT disclosure forms upon request. Likewise, Masévon Group B.V. requires all suppliers to comply with the Conflict Minerals Regulation as part of our General Terms of Purchase, ensuring accurate and complete disclosure throughout the supply chain.

Masévon Group B.V.'s responsible minerals declarations are based on information provided by suppliers and verified through reasonable due diligence. While we do not make absolute claims about mineral origins or smelter/refiner practices, we take this matter seriously and will actively follow up on any uncertainties to maintain compliance and uphold our environmental and human rights commitments.
